Anti-Bullying Policy AY 2024-2025

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I. Introduction

1.1. PURPOSE

At **IPS Mamzar (IPSM)**, we are committed to providing a **safe, inclusive, and respectful** learning environment. This policy aims to:

- Define bullying and its various forms.
- Establish procedures for preventing, reporting, and addressing bullying.
- Ensure compliance with **UAE laws, KHDA, and ADEK guidelines** on student well-being and safety.

1.2. SCOPE

This policy applies to **all IPSM students, staff, parents, and visitors**. It covers bullying incidents that occur:

- On school grounds, during school hours.
- At school-related events or activities.
- Online (cyberbullying) or off-campus if the behavior impacts the school environment.

1.3. OBJECTIVES

- **Prevent** bullying through education and awareness.
- **Encourage** students and staff to report bullying incidents.
- **Ensure** a clear process for handling and resolving cases.
- **Support** victims and rehabilitate offenders.

1.4. ALIGNMENT WITH UAE AND ADEK GUIDELINES

This policy aligns with **ADEK and KHDA** regulations, **UAE Federal Law No. 3 of 2016** (Child Rights Law), and the UAE's **moral education framework**, ensuring the highest standards of student protection.

II. ANTI-BULLYING POLICY

2.1 Definition of Bullying

Bullying is **intentional, repeated, and harmful behavior** aimed at intimidating, humiliating, or harming another person. It includes:

- **Verbal Bullying** – Name-calling, threats, insults.
- **Physical Bullying** – Hitting, pushing, stealing belongings.
- **Social/Relational Bullying** – Spreading rumours, exclusion.
- **Cyberbullying** – Harmful online messages, impersonation, cyber threats.

III. PREVENTION AND REPORTING

3.1 Preventative Measures

- **Awareness Campaigns** – School-wide initiatives promoting respect and inclusion.
- **Staff Training** – Teachers are trained to recognize and handle bullying.
- **Student Pledge** – All students sign an **Anti-Bullying Contract** (Appendix A).
- **Parental Involvement** – Regular parent workshops on bullying awareness.

3.2 Reporting & Investigation

Step 1: Immediate intervention – ensure victim safety.

Step 2: Confidential investigation – interview involved parties.

Step 3: Disciplinary actions – consequences based on severity.

Step 4: Follow-up support – monitor and prevent recurrence.

IV. CYBERBULLYING POLICY & CONSEQUENCES

4.1 Cyberbullying Definition

Using digital platforms (social media, emails, messages) to harass, threaten, or harm others.

4.2 Consequences

- **First Offense** – Counselling + parental notification.
- **Repeated Offenses** – Device restrictions + suspension.
- **Severe Cases** – Expulsion + legal action if necessary.

4.3 Prevention Strategies

- Digital Safety Education for students.
- Parental training on monitoring online activity.
- School IT monitoring to detect inappropriate behavior.

- **Bullying:** Repeated, intentional harm caused to another person.
- **Cyberbullying:** Online harassment or intimidation.
- **Well-Being Committee:** A school team that handles student welfare concerns.
